Local Trafficked Youth Reached

AbolitionNC and The Phoenix Alliance are partnering to impact lives at the Guilford County Juvenile Detention Center.

Through the use of AbolitionNC's human trafficking curriculum, The Phoenix Alliance Co-Founders and FreewayNC Youth Educators, Ethan and Kimberly Wheeler, are connecting with and educating teens in the detention center. Ethan Wheeler said it is estimated that 85% of the female juvenile population at the center are trafficking victims.

"The FreewayNC curriculum has become the foundation of our connection with the girls, opening doors for many opportunities to foster long-term relationships with struggling youth," Kimberly said.

"We recently spoke with a girl who was in jail again and had been through the program before. She was out with one of her friends, also a former student of ours, and they saw something concerning and remembered the number for the human trafficking hotline. She was

also in a situation when she had to choose between potential harm or getting locked up again, and she

chose to go with the police because of our warnings for her safety," Kimberly said.

The Wheelers believe that most of the girls don't realize they are victims of trafficking until they are taught the lessons. Through the

animated videos, they connect with the characters and realize it is telling their story. *(continued on pg. 2)*

“The curriculum is so well done and so thorough. It tells you the questions to ask. It tells you the things to say. It helps you with conversations starters. The videos are excellent and engaging,” Ethan said. “There’s nothing else I know of that’s as effective as this curriculum happening in the state. If we don’t educate children on the warning signs and the tactics of traffickers then predators roam free and unchallenged. This is where most of our time, focus and energy should be. The more this gets out in the state, the fewer kids we’re going to see falling prey,” Ethan said.

Staff from the center have also indicated that they see a difference in the youth who are exposed to the curriculum. “The goal is to empower our youth through education, while bringing about a heightened level of awareness to the situations they have been placed in. Recognizing the dangers of their personal choices is key to preventing further abuse and trauma,” said Teresa Cuthbertson, Program Manager at the center.

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AbolitionNC Trains Over 24,000 School Staff

AbolitionNC is gearing up for another year of training NC school staff using the *Protect Our Students* online course. AbolitionNC trained over 24,000 NC school staff during the 2020-2021 school year. The training prepares staff to recognize and respond to trafficking and child sexual abuse (CSA). Guilford County Schools was among the 14 districts who participated. NC law requires staff to receive training on trafficking and CSA biennially.

“It’s incredible the impact we’re having in North Carolina classrooms. The teachers that we’ve trained work with over 220,000 students. We’re giving these teachers the information they need to identify and respond to suspected abuse or trafficking. And we’re able to provide this training at no cost,” said Cindy King, Executive Director.

A study of *Protect Our Students* was conducted to evaluate the effectiveness of the training experience. Results support the evidence-based effectiveness of *Protect Our Students*. The study also establishes the validity of the training as a trauma-informed resource.
